



Pre Shoot Checklist

Preparing your property using this pre-shoot checklist helps ensure a smooth photography session and allows us to capture your home at its very best.

Exterior

- *Remove vehicles from the driveway and front of the home.*
- *Store trash bins, garden tools, hoses, and other outdoor clutter out of sight.*
- *Mow the lawn, tidy landscaping, and sweep walkways and driveways.*
- *Clean exterior windows if needed.*
- *Arrange patio or deck furniture neatly and remove toys or pet items.*

Interior

- *Declutter countertops, tables, and floors throughout the home.*
- *Replace any burned-out light bulbs and ensure lights are working.*
- *Open blinds and curtains to maximize natural light.*
- *Turn off TVs, computer monitors, and ceiling fans.*
- *Make beds, straighten pillows, and tidy furniture and décor.*
- *Put away shoes, laundry, pet items, and personal belongings.*
- *Remove sensitive personal information, family photos, and visible paperwork.*

Kitchen & Dining

- *Clean sinks, countertops, and appliance surfaces; leaving only a few tasteful decorative items.*
- *Remove magnets, notes, and photos from the refrigerator.*
- *Store trash cans out of sight.*
- *Straighten bar stools and dining chairs.*

Bathroom

- *Clear countertops of personal care items.*
- *Clean mirrors, countertops, and fixtures.*
- *Open shower curtains and remove bottles, razors, and other toiletries.*
- *Close toilet lids and store trash cans and toilet brushes out of sight.*
- *Display fresh, neatly folded towels for a clean, inviting look.*

Day of Shoot Tips

- *If possible, arrange for pets to be off-site or safely secured during the session.*
- *Designate a temporary storage area for any last-minute items to keep rooms clutter-free.*
- *Feel free to walk through the home with your photographer before the session to discuss any priorities or special features.*
- *Once the shoot begins, allow the photographer the time and space needed to capture each room efficiently and with attention to detail.*
